
## STUDENT HANDOUT 3-THE LAYOUT ON TINICUM ISLAND

- A. Cupola or lookout point: dome made of glass
- B. **Bargeman's House:** The bargeman transported the doctor and quarantine master to the various vessels on the water. This man stayed up all night to watch the Delaware River.
- C. Boat house: where the boats are kept
- D. **Delaware River**
- E. Lazaretto Physician's House: residence of doctor of the hospital and of inspections
- F. Main House, Administration, or Hospital: the building in which the sick were treated
- G. **Quarantine Landing:** 120 foot, railed platform wharf where people awaited inspections; If you look closely, you can see a bell at the river's edge, near the flagpole, which was rung upon sight of incoming ship.
- H. Quarantine Master's House: Inspection master
- I. Watch House

<sup>\*</sup>According to the *Public Ledger* (Philadelphia): 1879, there was often hoisted on the "tall staff in front... the yellow Quarantine flag on which is painted a large black Q."
