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Worksheet 2: Mapping a Town: A Blueprint for Building Your Own Community



- 7. Draw an illustration of the clothes the community members will wear. Are there any special symbols? Is color used in any special way?
- 8. Draw a map of your community on a separate sheet of paper.
 - a. Write the name of your town on your map.
 - b. Make a key to show the geographical forms (mountains, waterways, roadways)
 - c. Decide where the best placement will be for each building.
 - d. Draw and label the buildings in your town. Explain where various family groups will be living? Be sure to include workplaces for all the trades people your town will need.

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Worksheet 3: View of Bethlehem, 1757




"A View of Bethlehem one of the Brethren's Principal Settlements in Pensylvania [sic] North America, Nicholas Garrison

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Worksheet 4: Plan of Bethlehem, 1766



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Worksheet 5: Town plan of Lititz, PA, 1759




Lititz, Pennsylvania's town plan was made in 1759.

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Worksheet 6: Town plan of Lebanon, PA, 1761




The Moravian Community at Lebanon, Pennsylvania, was just north of Lititz.

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Worksheet 7: Town plan of Salem, North Carolina, 1766




The Moravians also drew up plans for a Community in Salem, North Carolina in 1766..

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Worksheet 8: Town plan of Emmaus, PA, 1767




Another plan was developed for the Community at Emmaus
